Registrations for School Year 2024 2025

We are now accepting registrations for all grades for September 2024 2025!

If you are a resident of the Winnipeg School Division:

*NURSERY (CHILD BORN IN 2020) or KINDERGARTEN PROGRAM (CHILD BORN IN 2019): There is no fee if you live within the division. There are several forms that you will need to fill out as well as various documents you will need to provide (Please see checklist on our school website)

*GRADE 1-GRADE 6 (No Fee): Same documents as above

If you are NOT a resident of the Winnipeg School Division:

*NURSERY PROGRAM (FEE): You will be required to fill out several forms and provide documentation as well as pay the fee of \$5900.00 (subject to change) for the school year.

*KINDERGARTEN-GRADE 6 (No Fee): You will need to fill out the forms and provide the documentation as well as fill out a Non-Resident Form

ALL REGISTRATIONS ARE BASED ON APPROVAL BY PRINCIPAL

If your child attends Tyndall Park School:

*NURSERY-GRADE 6: Students will be automatically preregistered for next year at the same school

If your child will be changing schools:

Please inform the office immediately if you are planning on changing schools. You will need to fill out registration forms at the forwarding school. Students in Grade 6 will have received forms from Stanley Knowles School in the spring.

FESTIVAL DU VOYAGEUR IN GRADE 5/6








WHAT IS LIKE TO BE A VOYAGEUR?




GRADE 1 IS BUSY!




YOUNG DESIGNERS COMES TO AN END






SMUDGING CLUB

ONLINE SAFETY IN GRADE 5/6

Officers from the Winnipeg Police Service visited Tyndall Park School's grade 5 & 6 students to deliver a presentation about 'Online Safety'. It was very informative! Students learned about the pros and cons to online activities such as gaming and social media. They also learned about screen time's negative effect on mental health, creating a digital footprint, and the legal age of consent when downloading and using Apps. The constables stressed that hobbies and interests other than technology is very important to children's well-being. Please remember to limit screen time and monitor content. Have conversations with your child about what they do online.



ROOTS of EMPATHY









In February, our focus was on Safety. Mommy Huma shared to the students that since Nova has been crawling a lot now, they have to baby-proof their home. The information she shared reinforced the learning that the students had during the previsit.

There were also discussions on how to protect the baby from the harms of secondhand smoke, alcohol intake during pregnancy, as well as reducing Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) when babies are put to sleep on their backs.

Our Little Teacher Nova showed us a range of emotions on this visit, too. She started off in a happy and active mood, however she got tired and hungry so we had to pause for a snack break. Once full, she was again happy and even clapped. Way to go, Nova! We are excited to celebrate your next milestones!


