Recently, the WSD Indigenous Education news highlighted a few of our teachers for their work they have been doing with and on the land.

Grade 4/5 students at Clifton School along with their teacher, Summer-Lee Kuzyk and Indigenous Learning Support Teacher Sarah Luhowy, engage in nature-based literacy learning to understand and represent the **Haudenosaunee Thanksgiving Address**. This is part of Clifton School's journey in discovering and acknowledging the story of the land their school sits on.

The Grade 5/6 class with their teacher Mel Schultz have explored what it means to engage in the process of writing a personal land acknowledgement.

This year marks the 75th anniversary of our school and planning is well underway to commemorate this milestone. The celebration will take place over two dates. On **Thursday, May 29th from 6:00 to 7:30 PM** families are invited to join us for a **showcase of student performances** featuring singing and dancing, along with displays of student work highlighting play-based learning, nature-based learning, and school history. Students will be sharing their learning about the land that Clifton School is situated on, and have written their own Land Acknowledgement, either individually or as a class. The school will also be decorated through the decades, offering a nostalgic and engaging experience for families and guests.

In addition, on SATURDAY May 30th from 11:00 am – 2:00 pm, a special *event for Clifton Alumni is being planned*, giving former students a chance to wander the halls and revisit their youth. Much more information to come.

Room 9 Grades 2 and 3

April has been full of hands on learning and creativity in Room 9! In Science, students have been exploring the forces of magnets and static electricity. We had a lot of fun experimenting with balloons, timing how long we could get them to stick to the wall using static charge! We also learned about how compasses work and why they always point north. In Writing, our focus has been on real-world connections - students wrote friendly letters to their pen pals and even started letters to their future selves! To help organize their ideas, we practiced using "word splashes," brainstorming lots of words and phrases before beginning a piece of writing. In Art, we celebrated spring by creating beautiful Pysanky-inspired agg **art** using pastel watercolour paints. Students carefully wrote artist state<mark>ments</mark> to describe their work and reflect on their artistic choices. In Math, we continued strengthening our multiplication skills cuisenaire rods to model groups, and we've just started our exciting unit on fractions. Finally, in Social Studies, we are beginning to explore maps, learning how to recognize important features like symbols, legends, and compass roses. It's been wonderful to see students so engaged and excited about their learning!

Room 4 Grades 3 and 4

Wow, the month of April flew by! Room 4 has been so engaged in a variety of learning activities that we hardly noticed the days passing. Even though it was a shorter month, we made the most of every moment through hands-on experiences and meaningful exploration. Our class has been buzzing with creativity and curiosity across all areas of learning—Art, Science, Math, Writing, Social Studies, and Nature-Based Education. Each student had the opportunity to shine, showcasing their talents and imaginative thinking. One of the highlights this month was our beautiful watercolor butterfly art, reflecting on our theme: "Growing with Nature: A Season of Happiness." To honor Earth Day, we created thoughtful posters expressing our respect and responsibilities as caretakers of Mother Earth, and we wrote our own personal Land Acknowledgements to show gratitude for the land we live and learn on. As we wrapped up our Science Unit on the states of matter, students presented their understanding of solids, liquids, and gases through detailed charts and creative dioramasit was inspiring to watch their ideas take shape. Throughout the month, Room 4 students also enjoyed working in pairs and groups, tackling real-life math problems and participating in collaborative STEAM activities that strengthened their critical thinking, creativity, and teamwork. It's been a joyful and enriching month of growth and discovery in Room 4!

Room 3 Grades 4 and 5

We just came back from an awesome spring break! We learned some more about parts whole boxes and connected the parts whole boxes to the **cuisenaire rods** so we can see it visually. For our math warm ups, we are doing mystery numbers made by room 3 students. Mystery number is where we use clues to narrow down to one specific number.

In Science, we are learning about weather and how it can affect people and animals. In S.T.E.A.M, we have done coding, dioramas with coding and made homes for Teddy Pig that can withstand a fan to represent weather conditions. We also did coding with the Talebots for example, getting them through our diorama, explaining the water cycle and making them a course to go though. We love learning with the Tale-bots and seeing them dance at the end!
