The Montrose School culture encourages students and families to live an active lifestyle at school and at home. Our Outdoor Education program is based upon Manitoba Education's pillars for sustainable development - Economy, Environment, and Human Health and Wellbeing. Students at Montrose school work with their teachers and leaders from Assiniboine Park Conservancy to uncover all of the amazing natural wonders in our school community! STEAM

This year we also continued our STEAM program. This program is available to all students in Nursery to Grade 6. Students develop their creativity, collaboration, and communication skills through design challenges, coding and building. The STEAM program finished off the year by hosting our second Cardboard Arcade for our community- which was a huge hit for the students and community members alike!

Outdoor Education- We will continue our partnership with Assiniboine Park Conservancy and seek ways to enrich the habitat that our school is a part of- including raising bees.


