## Winter Weather Reminder

As winter weather arrives, please remember that our students will be going outside for recess every day, except during extreme weather conditions. If the temperature falls to -28°C or lower, recess will be held indoors.

We want all students to be safe, comfortable, and able to enjoy their time outdoors. To help keep your child warm and prepared, we recommend they wear:

- Winter boots
- Warm winter jacket
- Ski pants
- Toque
- Gloves or mittens

Keeping an extra pair of socks in their backpack is also a good idea for snowy and slushy days, so they'll always have a warm, dry pair ready when needed.



## **Student Early Dismissal Policy**





Over the past term we have been busy and having fun learning about the alphabet. The students have been learning what a letter is, how we use letters and how they each make their own sounds. We have also been learning how to write the letters using lines and curves in both the upper and lowercase formations.

As the students learn about letters they have been learning that letters are used to form words and with that they have been learning how to write simple words like 'at' and how to build upon them by adding beginning and ending sounds.

Students have been busy learning how to read the words they are writing as well so that they can see the relationship between reading and writing. As they learn about how letters form words, they are learning that words can be short or long and determine how many words are in a sentence. Students have begun reading simple pattern texts using 1:1 correspondence to track the print in their stories.










## **Room 115 Explores Manitoba's Extreme Weather**



At Wellington, we set aside time on November 8 for the whole school to pause and consider the significance of Remembrance Day. Remembrance Day is a somber reminder of the horror of war, the cost in human suffering, and the debt we owe to those who sacrificed their lives in these causes. Most importantly, it is a call to all of us that taking up arms should be the last resort in resolving any conflict.

We recognized National Indigenous Veterans Day that honours the contributions of First Nations, Metis, and Inuit people who participated in Canada's military efforts. First Nation, Metis and Inuit people have served in every conflict that Canada has fought including the war of 1812, WW1, WWII, the Korean War, and in Afghanistan. Remembrance Day honours the soldiers who volunteered, fought for freedom, and for many who lost their lives during the war. By remembering their service and their sacrifice, we recognize the brave people who courageously volunteered for the cause of freedom and peace.
