

Registration opened <u>February 10</u> for the 2025-2026 School Year. If you know of families who do not receive our Newsletter, please pass this information to them. We require proof of age such as Birth Certificate for all Nursery and Kindergarten registrations. Early registration facilitates our planning process for September 2025.

Nursery

Children born in 2021 must be 4 years old by December 31, 2025.

Kindergarten

Children born in 2020 must be 5 years old by December 31, 2025.

The school office is open daily from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm until June 27th. School Office will re-open on August 25th at 8:30 am.






We ask parents to please go over the lunchroom rules with your children on a regular basis: Our policy follows School Division guidelines. When a child misbehaves the first time, a verbal warning will be given. The second time, a written letter will be sent home. Within this letter it will state that your child will be removed from the Lunch Program. Then you will need to make alternate arrangements for your child. In the event of a serious incident your child WILL BE REMOVED immediately without warning.

We would like to encourage you not to send soda pop or noodles. Nut and seafood alleraies among children are **becoming** increasingly common; therefore we have a NO NUTS & SEAFOOD policy. We have many other allergies as well, children are not allowed to share or exchange their snacks or lunches.

Exploring Living Things at Assiniboine Park Zoo

On April 22nd, the Grade 1/2 classrooms visited the Assiniboine Park Zoo to explore the characteristics and needs of living things. Students observed how animals depend on their environment to meet their basic needs. During our guided tour, students learned about animals and their habitat. The day concluded with a sharing circle to give students time to reflect on their experiences and share their learning. More photos from our field trip is available on Seesaw.

Language Arts: Enhancing Writing Skills

In Language Arts, students are continuing to develop their writing skills through various forms of writing, including narrative, persuasive, descriptive, and expository writing. We have also been focusing on descriptive words and how to use them effectively in our writing. Please continue to engage in home reading regularly. Reading every night helps your child build strong reading and vocabulary skills.

Mathematics: Exploring Numbers and Patterns

In Math, students are learning to represent numbers using a variety of mathematical manipulatives, including Base Ten Blocks, Cuisenaire rods, and Digi-Blocks. These manipulatives help students visualize numbers and understand place value more clearly. Students are also learning to collect data and represent it on graphs. This month, each student will independently create their own graph by choosing a topic, gathering data, and presenting their findings to the class. This hands-on project allows students to develop self-confidence and take ownership of their learning.

Science: Understanding Our Environment

In Science, students are discussing ways to protect the Earth and how we can make a positive impact on our surroundings. Students will continue engaging in outdoor learning activities, where they will document their findings through careful observations and research. These activities focus on understanding the Earth's natural resources and ecosystems.


Social Studies: Exploring Cultures Around the World
