










LUNCH PROGRAM (Dixie Halladay)






We would like to remind parents the fees are due on the <u>1st of</u> <u>each month.</u> Please <u>remember</u> to pay the fees on time. Failure to do so will result in your child being <u>removed</u> from the program. A reminder to lunch program parent - Please let us know in writing when you are allowing your child to go home or to a friend's house for lunch. The safety of your child is our first concern. Students can register for lunch program if parents <u>work</u> or go to <u>school</u>. Please do not <u>send your child with warm-ups for lunch</u>.

We ask parents to please go over the lunchroom rules with your children on a regular basis: Our policy follows School Division guidelines. When a child mis-behaves the first time, a verbal warning will be given. The second time, a written letter will be sent home. Within this letter it will state that your child will be removed from the Lunch Program. Then you will need to make alternate arrangements for your child. In the event of a serious incident - your child WILL BE REMOVED immediately without warning.


