

September & October in Room 7

It has been a wonderful start to the year in Grade 1 and 2 for Room 7! Over September and October, our class has focused on building a strong and caring community through sharing circles, outdoor learning, and affirmations that help us remember to be safe, respectful and responsible learners. In ELA, students have been developing their reading and writing stamina, practicing sentence structure and writing conventions, and expressing their creative ideas in clear, complete sentences. In Math, we have been learning about skip counting, making 10 pairs, and exploring place value to understand how numbers work together. We have also been busy with hands-on provocations using leaves, sunflowers and pumpkins. Students asked thoughtful questions, explored seeds, and practiced counting, patterning and grouping as part of our Math, Art and Science connections. These explorations encouraged curiosity, problem-solving, and teamwork. We also took time to honour Orange Shirt Day and Terry Fox, celebrating the values of courage and caring for others. Our class enjoyed celebrating birthdays, Thanksgiving, and Halloween together—lots of smiles, teamwork, and fun!

Ms. Regier will soon be leaving on maternity leave. She will miss her students and Clifton School community but will be excited to return after her time away. A wonderful teacher, Ms. Deluca, will be joining Room 7 to continue teaching and learning alongside the students while Ms. Regier is away.













Room 9 Grades 1 and 2

Hello families of room 9!

Our class has been having so much fun helping Gilbert, a baby alien who's just landed on Earth and is trying to understand human life! So far, we've taught Gilbert why brushing your teeth is important and how to stay safe while trick-or-treating at night. These playful scenarios have sparked rich conversations and helped students practice empathy, communication, and critical thinking. If you're connected to your child's seesaw account, check out the videos they made for Gilbert!

We've also been diving into play-based learning, which is a powerful approach that encourages children to explore ideas through hands-on, imaginative play. After reading a story together, we discuss our questions, predictions, and inferences as a group. Then, students return to their tables and use building materials to represent something from the story-like the setting or a character. This method supports deeper comprehension and allows children to express their thinking in creative, meaningful ways. Play-based helps build problem-solving learning collaboration, and confidence, all while keeping engagement high and learning joyful!


