



LUNCH PROGRAM







Our Nursery and Kindergarten students will sing two special songs, and our Grade 1 and 2 students will present the musical "The Big Chill."



Meet our Public Health Nurse



Hello Wellington School Parents/Caregivers, Students, and Staff:

My name is Anne Sikora, and I am the current Public Health Nurse (PHN) for Wellington School. I am writing to introduce myself and to share a little bit about my role and how I can be a support to your school community.

As a PHN, I work with individuals, families, groups and communities to provide health promotion and illness prevention support across the life span. Families are referred to public health services in the prenatal or postpartum period for home visits, assessments and health education. Some of you may have had support from a PHN for this reason in the past.

In the schools, PHN's run immunization clinics for students who are in Grade 6 & 8 to provide vaccinations that are recommended by Manitoba Health. In this regard, I recently ran a Grade 6 immunization clinic at Wellington School to immunize those students whose parents granted consent to receive Hepatitis B, HPV and the Meningococcal vaccines.

I can also support the school community with health promotion and illness prevention education. I can answer questions about childhood growth and development, various illnesses, immunizations and can offer guidance/support with efforts to manage and get rid of challenges such as lice. If I am unable to help with the treatment/management of any matter, I can refer you to those who can assist you. If you wish to speak with me, please contact me at **204-612-1242**, Monday to Friday, between the hours of 9:00-5:00.

Going forward, I will occasionally submit information to your school newsletter regarding a health promotion topic. For this month, I would like to remind everyone that respiratory viruses such as influenza ("the flu"), COVID and RSV are prevalent every year from October until April. Strategies to protect yourselves from illness and to prevent spreading germs to others include:



Wash your hands before eating, after coughing or sneezing into your hand(s) and after toileting. Hand hygiene can be done by washing your hands with soap and water or by using an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.



Cover your cough/sneeze with your forearm instead of your hand(s).



If you have cold or flu-like symptoms, (e.g. fever/chills, cough, runny nose, body aches or are generally not feeling well), **STAY AT HOME**. Once the fever has resolved for at least 24 hours and other symptoms are improving, you can return to school or work. However, wear a mask around others until all your symptoms have resolved.



Get the Flu/COVID vaccine every Fall, to protect yourself and those who are most vulnerable to serious illness (i.e. children under 5 years of age, people 65 years+ and those who are immunocompromised). Immunizations can be obtained from primary care providers, pharmacies and in community locations at clinics run by Public Health.

In the Downtown West neighborhood, Public Health will be offering Flu/COVID immunization clinics for people who are 6 months of age and older. Please see the attached poster for information on the public immunization clinic that we are offering on **Thursday**, **November 13**, **2025**, at the Valour Orioles Community Centre, 448 Burnell St between the hours of 4:00 – 7:00 p.m. For information on additional clinics or options for other immunization catch-ups, please contact me directly at the cell phone number that I have provided above.

Cold Weather Reminder

As the chilly weather sets in, we'd like to remind our families that students will go outside for recess each day, except during extreme weather conditions. Please ensure your child comes to school dressed appropriately for the cold, as they will be expected to stay outdoors for recess whenever the temperature and windchill are colder than -28°C. Please always remind your child to wear/bring them, as they're essential for keeping hands warm and protected during outdoor activities.

Student Absence Reporting System

Report your child's absence in advance using one of these three easy methods:

- **Mobile App:** Download the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple App Store or Google Play Store, or use the links at https:// go.schoolmessenger.ca. Create an account the first time you use it by selecting Sign Up. Then choose Attendance and Report an Absence.
- **Website:** Visit https://go.schoolmessenger.ca. Create an account by selecting Sign Up, then choose Attendance and Report an Absence.
- **Phone:** Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to use the automated system to report an absence.

JUST a reminder:

If you receive an automated phone call from the school saying your child is absent, please respond by pressing the appropriate button. This will let the school know your response.

If you hang up and call the school directly, it won't stop the automated call from reaching you.

If you don't want to receive notifications when your child is absent, be sure to report your child's absence in advance.

These options are available 24/7, and you can report future absences at any time.
