This fall, students from Grades 1 through 6 had a special treat in music class—a visit from singer-songwriter Donna Orchard! Known for her warm voice and cheerful ukulele playing, Donna led a series of songwriting workshops that brought the spirit of autumn to life through music.

- © Creating autumn magic through song during the workshops students worked together to write original lyrics inspired by the sights, sounds, and feelings of the fall season. From swirling leaves and pumpkin patches to cozy sweaters and apple picking, their ideas turned into beautiful verses and catchy choruses.
- Learning the Music Donna taught students how to shape their lyrics into songs, showing them how rhythm, rhyme, and melody work together. She played her ukulele while students clapped, sang, and even added their own musical touches using classroom instruments.
- Performing with the Artist at the end of each workshop, students performed their songs with Donna, turning the music room into a stage filled with joyful voices and autumn cheer. Some classes even added simple dance moves or sound effects to make their performances extra special.
- A Memorable Experience students said they loved working with a real musician and learning how songs are made from scratch. Donna praised their creativity and teamwork, saying she was "blown away by the imagination and heart in every song."






Nursery Kindergarten

This month has been busy for our room 110 N/K class. The children have really taken an interest in pumpkins this season! Students explored the inside of a pumpkin, using their hands dig out and collect seeds to count. We also painted our own pumpkins using different shapes we've been learning about, helping to connect art with shape recognition. It's been wonderful to see their curiosity grow as they explore through play and creativity!









Rm 208 – Grade 4



Students from room 208 did some handprint tree art and showed their creativity by adding colours and details when painting. During this activity students used their fine motor skills and hand-eye coordination when tracing. Students felt more connected to nature during class discussions about the different seasons and how trees change throughout the different seasons. We concluded the project through story telling.



Rm 117 – Grade 2

The Grade 2 students enjoyed going outside with each other to participate in land-based learning. They each looked for and collected various kinds of leaves, enhancing their appreciation and connection towards nature and land. Then they each used their artistic and creative skills to put their collected leaves together on plates.







Rm 118 – Grade 1

Room 118 is conducting an inquiry about the seasons, and we've become weather detectives. Our work involves observing and thinking about the changes we see throughout the year. I guide our learning by asking questions about what the students notice and wonder as each season changes. We are learning that seasons are a cycle and bring exciting changes to nature, from colorful flowers to cold, snowy days.

Currently, our work focuses on the fall season and the beautiful changes we observe outside, as well as the traditional activities, such as Halloween, that we participate in during this time. We also observed that the weather is getting cooler and the days are getting shorter. We are learning that fall is a time of transition and preparation in nature."













Rm 120 – Grade 3

Room 120 hosted a haunted house this Halloween. We planned, designed, and constructed our props and decorations. The students created huge jump scare boxes, spooky decorations, silly streamers, mystery boxes and even dioramas with mystery scenes to look at. This has been a very fun project for us!









Rm 208 – Grade 4

Room 208 enjoyed a fun and hands-on-pumpkin carving project. Students explored pumpkins using five senses to observe how they look, feel and smell. Students made predictions about the pumpkins' weight, size and number of seeds. They worked together to design creative pumpkin faces. Through this project, students developed teamwork, creativity, and made connections to numeracy and art. The activity encouraged curiosity and excitement for learning!
