- To plan for our next meeting and prepare to have an election for the various positions of the parent council

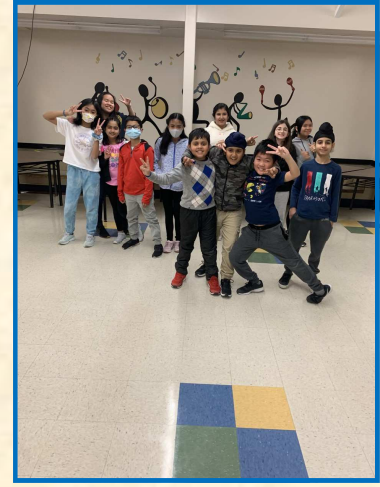
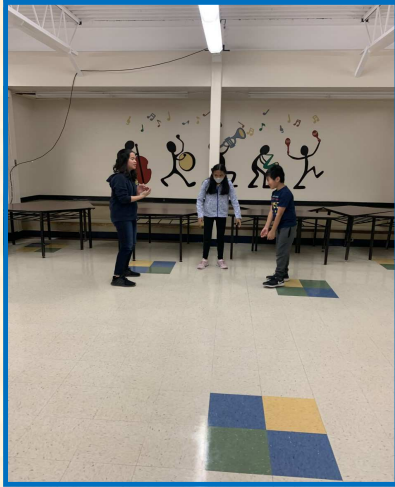

DRAMA CLUB

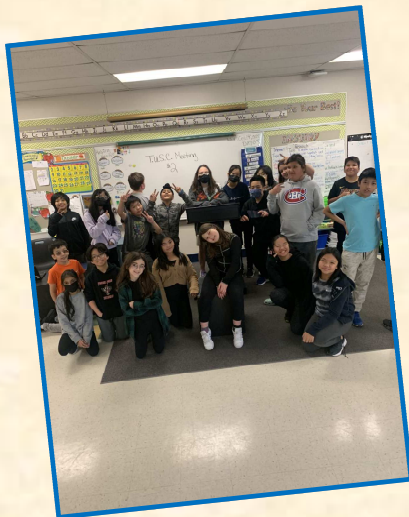

P1 also hosted an eerie 'Haunted House' that classes were able to sign up to walk through, if they dared!

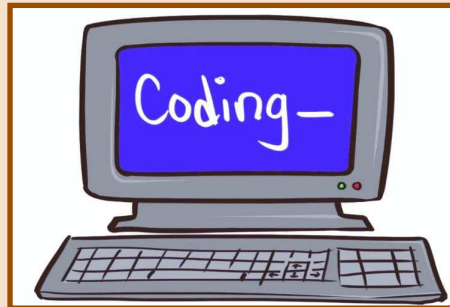
UNITED WAY

Light jacket
