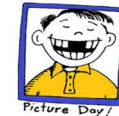
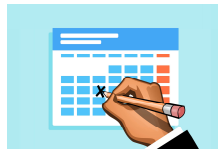

Ellen Douglas Charity – Community Message

Below is some information we are passing on regarding a community charity.

A number of years ago a few parents of children who were going to Lord Roberts School in the cluster program of students living with special needs decided to create a charity.

The charity, called the Ellen Douglass Access and Integration Foundation, was intended to enable the parents to conduct fundraising activities with a goal of helping the school's special needs program receive equipment, additional items or other things deemed needed which would not be funded by the school division or the province.

The school division itself has an overall charity program, but it was seen that a charity operated by parents of the children themselves at the school would have more options open to them.

Unfortunately, given the time it took the charity to be set up, organized, and approved by the Canada Revenue Agency, the students who were part of the program had already graduated from the school.

Since then, the charity has basically been dormant, with the executive (parents) at the time filing annual reports saying there had been no activity.

Now, the CRA is wondering, because the foundation has been inactive for so long, whether it should be wrapped up or not.

So, what we are wondering before this happens, is if there are any parents or guardians connected with students in the program who would like to find out more about this charity and to see if they are interested in taking it over.
