Scholarships Opportunities Are Open to All

Did you know that students can apply to scholarships as early as Grade 9? Whereas the majority of opportunities are allocated to post-secondary, there are individual options out there! Not sure where to look? The guidance office has a scholarship binder available, and here are some websites to check out!

Before you start, complete a professional inventory. Write down a list of work experience volunteer initiatives, leadership roles, extracurriculars, sports, music, accomplishments, certifications/professional

development courses, grade average, and other portfolio items you can use to identify your achievements.

Research Scholarship Databases, University Websites, Government Scholarship Programs, Professional Associations, and Organizations, and location-specific scholarships. Make a list of the sites you visit, names of scholarships, and deadlines for application.

Review the eligibility criteria for each scholarship, weighing it against your portfolio to identify if you meet scholarship requirements.

Criteria may include academic achievement, extracurricular involvement, community service,

Begin the application process. Apply for a variety of scholarships to increase your chances of receiving financial support. Don't limit yourself to only a few opportunities.

Reminder to give yourself enough time to retrieve any items needed days to weeks before given deadlines.
