
Room 132

For the month of September Room 132 focused on making connections and building relationships with one another. We began our day with Morning Warm-Up activities that encouraged communication, collaboration, critical thinking and creativity.



Not only are we strengthening the relationships with each other, we have continued to build our relationships with the land in our community. We have taken community walks noticing the changes in the seasons using our senses, wondered what the community was like long ago and practiced mindfulness as we tried a silent walk. Our upcoming field trip to Fort Whyte Alive at the beginning of October will give us other perspectives on the People of the Prairies and deepen our knowledge of the land.





As we continue to explore identity and history, our class is reflecting on the Four Guiding Questions shared by Honourable Murray Sinclair: Who am I? Where do I come from? Why am I



here? Where am I going? These questions help us celebrate our personal stories while learning about Canada's past. In preparation for the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, we've been reading Fatty Legs by Christy Jordan-Fenton and Margaret Pokiak-Fenton—a powerful memoir about an eight-year-old girl's experience in a residential school in Canada's North.

Inspired by this story, as well as the Witness Blanket installation at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights, and books such as The Name Jar, The Proudest Blue, and Métis Like Me, our class has created a visual representation that shares who we are and what matters to us.



Once again Robertson school was excited to participate in the Terry Fox School run. For more than 3 decades, Robertson school has helped raise money for the Terry Fox Foundation and on September 15, 2025, Robertson school ran once more around the school neighborhood to show their support. Terry never quit on his dream of a world without cancer. With the help of all Robertson students and staff,



they did their part in support of cancer research while building fantastic school spirit! Congratulations to everyone for supporting our school's fight against cancer and showing a no-quit attitude in honour of Terry.

Room 104 News - September Edition

Welcome to a brand new school year! It's been a wonderful start in our Grade 5/6 classroom, filled with connection, curiosity, and a whole lot of learning. This month, we've focused on building a positive classroom community by establishing routines, getting to know one another, and having some fun along the way.

In Writer's Workshop, we've launched our narrative writing unit. Students have been busy brainstorming ideas for their personal stories, drawing inspiration from their own lives and imaginations. We're excited to see these ideas take shape in the coming weeks.

In Math, we kicked things off with a unit on place value to build a strong foundation for the year ahead. We've also been learning how to work effectively in groups. As a class, we created criteria for successful group work, and students are already showing great teamwork during math tasks.

In Social Studies, our focus has been on Indigenous education. We've begun learning about the history, cultures, and contributions of Indigenous Peoples, and are looking forward to deepening our understanding throughout the year.

It's been a fantastic start, and we're looking forward to everything the rest of the term has in store!
