Dear Parent/Guardians and Families,

It has been a great start to the year so far! As students and staff settle into familiar routines, the sights and sounds of movement in the halls and students in classes have ignited within our school once again. Having a busy start to the year, classroom learning has blossomed with a new energy in the school, and we all look forward to the experiences that this year has to offer.

It was wonderful to see all the families who participated in our Meet the Staff night. Having the doors open to the parents and the community is a continued goal we want to have here at Wellington School. We believe in working with families and community to ensure the best educational programming for all our students.

To raise funds for cancer research, all students participated in the Terry Fox Run. It is amazing to see the level of support for such a great cause. From the bake sale to the assembly and field run/walk, thank you to all organizers to make this year's event possible.

All students from Nursery to grade 6 learned about the significance of "Orange Shirt Day" - Truth and Reconciliation Day through classroom discussions and infused lessons about the history of Residential schools and the impact on the Indigenous community. Throughout the weeks leading up to Truth and Reconciliation Day we had a daily read aloud from the Grandmother and Grandfather: Native Reflections Book Series that taught the importance of Elders, Eagle Feathers, Dream Catchers, The Drum, and Smudging that afterwards teachers had whole class discussions about. Staff members and students wore orange and participated in a community walk to honor survivors and children that were gone too soon. We had an assembly followed by a community walk to help raise and support awareness.

This year, Ms. Calanza and Ms. Norie switched up pancake breakfast to our first ever Poutine-a-palooza. It was a hit!! On October 1st the wonderful smell of french-fries, gravy and cheese filled the air, and we were able to serve over 300 poutines. Thank you to all staff who made this event possible.

The breakfast program has now started and is in full swing. Students can access this free program every day starting at 8:30. Breakfast is held in the MPR and the Beverley Street doors (closest to the gym) open at 8:30 until 9:00. Late arrivals will also have the opportunity to access the program and grab a bite on their way to class.

We want to thank everyone again for a successful and positive start to the school year. We ask that our families and community take time to enjoy the wonderful fall, and to stay safe, healthy and happy.








### LUNCH PROGRAM






Students are learning about what makes them special and unique and celebrating their differences!

We learned that everyone has similarities and differences! We all have fingerprints, but our finger prints are unique to us!


We read the book Be Who You Are by Todd Parr and learned about loving ourselves and our friends.









