## ADMINISTRATIVE MESSAGE

It seems the right month with Thanksgiving on the horizon to say how thankful Ms. Perrun and I are to work here at Keewatin Prairie. Everywhere we turn, we see commitment to children and to rich learning opportunities. There has been much enthusiasm as students have engaged in their activities this past month. A big thank you to all of our families for your support and your cooperation as we came back to school. We continue to send our newsletter out by 'School Messenger' (e-mail) as an alternative to the paper copy as well it is posted on our website. Please ensure your e-mail is up to date so that you do not miss important information.

Each school in the WSD follows the division protocol for preparing for school emergencies. This includes: bus evacuation drills (Bus Ridership), school evacuation drills (e.g. fire drills and relocation practice) and lockdown drills. We have now completed our first fire drill (out of 10 per year), two lockdown practices, and our evacuation practice to the Adolescent Parent Centre at the end of our playground. Students did a marvellous job listening and following instructions as we discussed the process.

Congratulations to James in Grade 9. He competed in the 2800m (2.8km) event at the Cross-Country meet at the Old Ex Grounds this past week and he placed 13th in his category. We are so proud of him.

A special thanks to Mr. Tam this month as he has filled in for us in the elementary gym program. Ms. Desrosier will be returning for October and she will be pleased with the great start the students have had. We wish Mr. Tam all the best. In staffing news, this month we welcomed Ms. Lefebvre to the clerical team in the Office. We are happy to have our Office team solidified.

Once more this year we will be part of the University of Manitoba, Faculty of Dentistry Variety Children's Dental Outreach Program. This program offers free dental service to our students who need. We have had our initial screening and you will be invited to participate if your child is requiring dental work. Children are transported to the Dental College and are provided supervision from our staff.

September 29 marks an important day for us all as we recognized the detrimental and systemic affects of the residential school system and its impact on so many children and their families. All classrooms have been having age appropriate discussions from understanding diversity, belonging, love and community to understanding the history and how we move forward in a positive way. We know that the conversations and the work will continue throughout the year and we are very proud of the students and the conversations.

This coming month we look forward to regular Halloween parties in our school. We will have a short parade to kick off the afternoon parties in our Big Gym and we welcome our families to join us at 1:15 pm on October 31.

A reminder that there are two 'No School' days in October: on Election Day-October 03 and on Friday, October 20. Have a great month!


## TERRY FOX RUN
