I am so grateful to be a part of such a caring and joyful classroom! -Ms. B

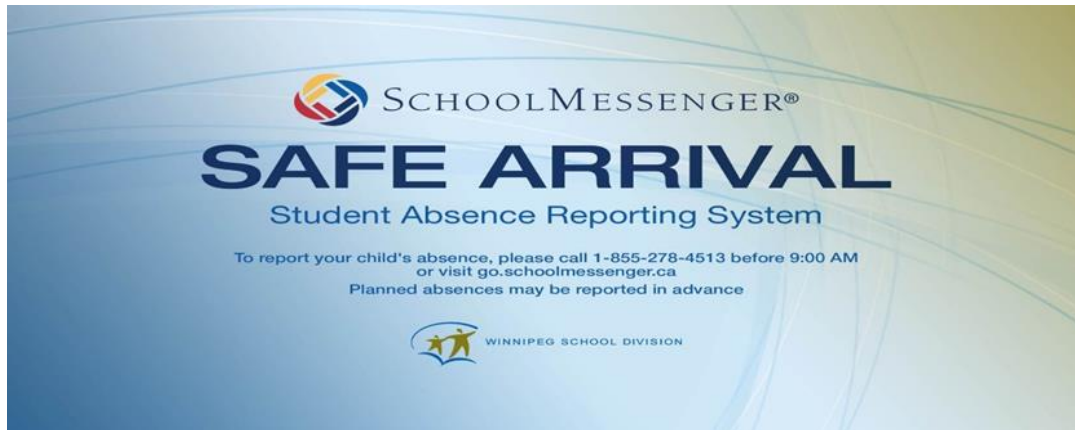
Welcome to Physical Education at Pinkham School!
