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## School Mission Statement

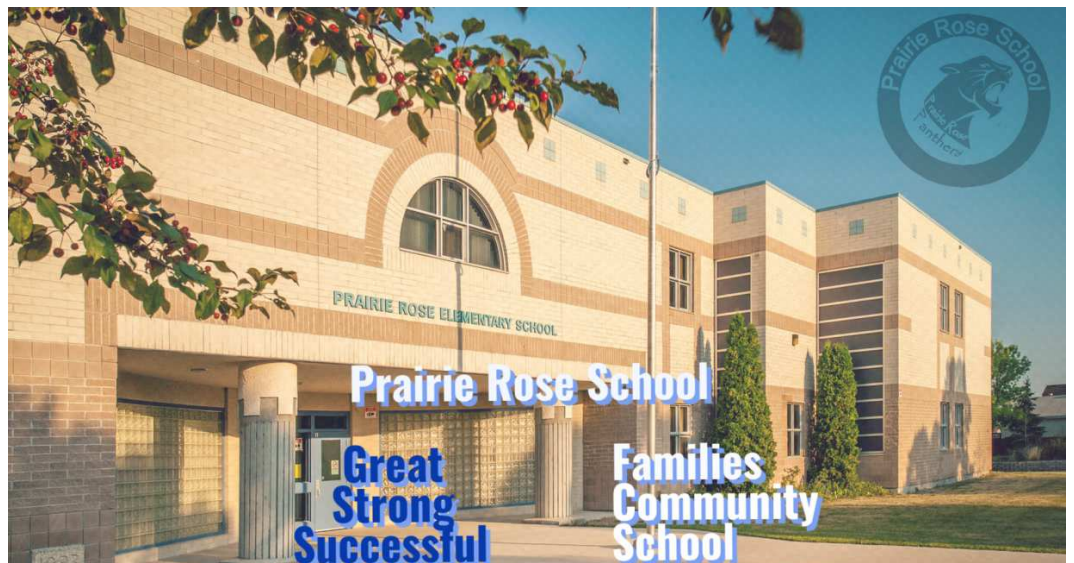

Prairie Rose School is a Nursery to Grade 6 school in the Northwest corner of the Winnipeg School Division in Cluster 2021. The school is home to an Adapted Skills Program and Nursery to Grade 6 classrooms. The ASP program combined with the integration of arts, sports, education for sustainable development along with high standards for academics, make Prairie Rose a wonderful school for students to learn, grow and flourish. This ensures that all students are included in the learning process according to their intellectual, social, emotional, and physical needs. We value community involvement in both curricular and extra-curricular activities. # Priorities for 2021 - 2022

**To provide all students with a comprehensive, equitable, diverse and supportive learning environment that will help prepare their learning journey with values and social justice to help them become responsible community members.**

- ◆ Elementary Assessment Program used to plan next steps for programming.
- ◆ Learning Pathways used to track student progress in Math.
- ◆ Fountas and Pinnell Reading Assessments used to chart student growth and focus on learning needs.
- ◆ Literacy Centers, Guided Reading, and best practices were utilized to assist with student growth.
- ◆ Classroom based performance data, reading comprehension, writing samples and observations used to determine next steps in planning.
- ◆ Technology was infused in all learning. Seesaw, DreamBox and Raz-Kids were some of the programs used.
- ◆ Electronic and hard copy learning Portfolios were shared with parents to document growth and monitor learning goals.
- ◆ Recovery Learning Support provided to identified students targeting key areas.
- ◆ Seesaw Online Learning was used for Remote Learning to continue school programming and keep students engaged and active with school activities and learning. The Seesaw platform was utilized to share Videos, Online Portfolios and Learning with Parents year round.

**To address learning barriers and learning outcomes with innovative approaches to meet all student needs and accessibility to programming.**

- ◆ Adapted Skills Program students received integrated programming as much as possible and whenever appropriate. Parallel activities were planned and arranged when required and following Cohorts.
- ◆ Added additional assistive technology and various hands on learning tools.
- ◆ Individual Education Plans were implemented and learning portfolios were also created.
- ◆ Zones of Regulation, Mindfulness Curriculum and Thrival Mental Health implemented .
- ◆ Support Staff worked to create individual and appropriate programming.

**To provide meaningful programming for students, during Remote Learning and for those attending In-class learning.**

- ◆ Arranged packages of learning resources for students to use in conjunction with the Online Home Learning as required.
- ◆ During Remote Learning and all year on Seesaw we had over 98,000 lessons posted for students and over 86,000 connections with students and over 38,000 parent interactions on our Seesaw Home Learning platform.

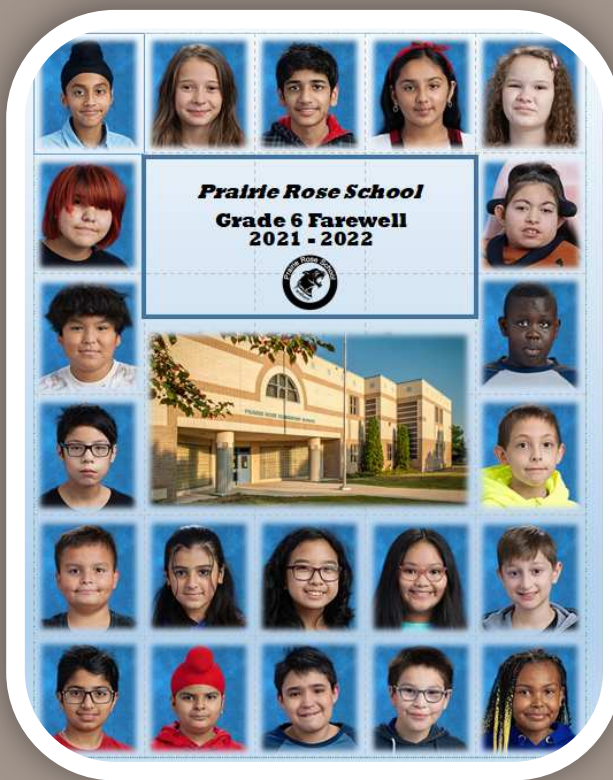
## Priorities for 2022 - 2023
