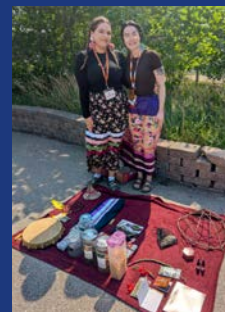

## 01. INDIGENOUS EDUCATION

Prairie Rose staff (teachers, educational assistants, clerk, and custodians) participated in a 2-day Treaty Education Training to learn more about Treaties and ways to integrate Indigenous Education more into daily lessons. We held a school-wide Indigenous Activity Day that involved different Indigenous education in six different stations: artwork, beading, outdoor games, dance (jig), food (Bannock) and Smudging. Thank you Ms. Whitney and Ms. Sydney for volunteering your time to teach us about Smudging. As a school, we had planned to attend our Divisional Pow Wow, but due to poor air quality health index, we were unable to attend this year and instead extended our learning at school with Indigenous activities.



## 02. INCLUSION & INTEGRATION



Prairie Rose School offers services to all students and gives access and opportunity for every single child. These opportunities include Special Olympics events, music therapy, food experience, adapted gym and aquatics, sensory and fine motor groups, and direct access to a full range of clinicians. Range of programming both in and out of the classrooms are based on students' individual strengths. Belonging is a basic human right that is practiced at Prairie Rose School. Prairie Rose School believes that inclusion benefits all children, with and without exceptionalities.



## 03. INTERSCHOOL SPORTS

Prairie Rose provided different opportunities for students to stay active and involved in different sporting activities. Students have participated in the following tournaments this year: volleyball, basketball, soccer, ultimate football and in addition to, participated in Track and Field and Fit Run. Intramurals also occurred every other day during the lunch hour. These included: floor hockey, soccer, dodgeball, ultimate football, badminton, basketball, volleyball and students practiced for Track and Field and Fit Run.







## PARENT / GUARDIAN INVOLVEMENT

Our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) has been an active support this year and provided different opportunities for input from parents/guardians during monthly PAC meetings. They helped with the monthly pizza lunch fundraisers and led the Chocolate Fundraiser. They also ran a Lunch Program and provided lunch supervision. Meet the Staff Night and Community BBQ has been a huge success this year! We drew prizes and invited local community agencies and members like the Bear Clan to attend. Parent/Teacher and Student-Led Conferences were a success with 97% attendance. It was helpful to have parents/guardians volunteer in school events and field trips.



## COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

We participated in a Truth and Reconciliation Assembly and Awareness Walk and Kindness Walk within our community. We also contacted Take Pride Winnipeg to provide us with garbage bags and gloves in order for staff and students to partake in a Community Clean-up in spring.

Our play-structure has been updated this year! We received a brand new play-structure and playground Communication Board for community members to enjoy the entire year.

On September 25th our school participated in the Terry Fox run. Throughout the month of September, students collected donations for cancer research. We collected just over \$400 for cancer research. Terry would be so proud!
