It was also an opportunity to talk about the importance of inclusion, acceptance, diversity, treaty-making and the seven teachings. The month culminated with an assembly, followed by a community walk allowing students to observe the community and reflect on how we can care for it. When we know and are proud of our identities, we can all move towards restoring relationships and work towards reconciliation. This month-long journey was a start of this recognition and work that will continue throughout the year.

October brings thoughts of Halloween and it is always an exciting time for our students. Teachers will soon decide what sort of festivities may take place in their classrooms. Activities will vary from class to class and teachers will share more information as the day approaches. Throughout the month of September, physical education learning has focused on safety and routines both inside and outside. Our grade 1 to 3 students have worked to develop transport skills (running, jumping, skipping, hopping, and galloping) through a variety of games and activities. Our grade 4 to 6 students have worked to build the manipulative skills required within the game of soccer. These skills are being built through a variety of games and skill-building activities.

#### **INTRAMURAL PROGRAMMING**

# **Dropping Students Off and Picking Students Up**

The morning and afternoon routines of dropping students off and picking them up from school has created some safety concerns for our students. We hope to mitigate these concerns with your support.

# Morning Drop-Off and Afternoon Pick-Up:

# Ash Street:


- If you are stopping on the street without parking to drop off or pick up your children, please use the Stop, Drop and Go Zone on Ash St. heading northbound.
- When you arrive at the Stop, Drop and Go Zone, please turn your hazard lights on to indicate you are dropping off a child and pull to the side of the street. Have your child/children exit on the curbside.
- Please do not use the Stop, Drop and Go Zone if heading southbound on Ash St. We would like to discourage ٠ southbound traffic on Ash St. as much as possible, but should you find yourself heading southbound on Ash St. please pull over to park and ensure your child is safely able to cross the street.

# **Oak Street:**

- Please do not stop to drop off or pick up your children on Oak St. as this is our school bus zone.
- If you need drop off or pick up your children on Oak St. please enter Oak St. from the Grosvenor intersection, park your vehicle in the direction of parked traffic and walk your child across the street.
- Please avoid using the staff parking lot and alley as a turn-around spot. Again, backing up in these spots creates a dangerous situation for young children crossing the street.

# Staff Parking Lot

The staff parking lot is not to be used for student drop off or pick up. Many families walk through the parking lot to access the early years entry door and having vehicles pull in and back out creates a very dangerous situation.
