Teachers are assessing students on an ongoing basis. Classroom data (reading levels, where students' writing is developing on a continuum, understanding in math) is reviewed and programming for learning is further developed and modified/differentiated. The provincial report card will be sent home electronically on Tuesday, November 14th, for nursery to Grade 6. Our reporting to you this month will include evidence of learning for your child, in relation to curricular outcomes. You can expect to read about what your child is currently able to do (their strengths); what they are not yet demonstrating on a consistent basis (their challenges); and next steps for their learning. It may also highlight what extension opportunities may be available for areas they are excelling in. You child's development will be further discussed during in-person parent-teacher conferences on Thursday, November 16th in the evening and Friday, November 18th in the afternoon. Information will come out shortly regarding scheduling your appointment(s) through School Interviews. Please remember that if, at any time during the year, you have concerns regarding your child's progress, you can contact your child's teacher.

We are happy to announce that our Scholastic Book Fair will be returning to the in-person format with books for sale in the school library during the evening and afternoon of parent-teacher conferences. Books make wonderful gifts for the holiday season, and any time! All book purchases continue to support our school library. During the month of October, learning in Physical Education for grades 1 to 3 focused on building transport skills (run, jump, hop, skip, and gallop) through a variety of games and activities. In addition, learning was focused around following the rules of a game in order to maintain safety. Grade 4 to 6 students focused on the fitness management portion of the Physical Education curriculum, working to build stamina through a variety of games. The focus was on maintaining a moderate to vigorous-intensity level for the duration of an activity. Students also worked to build knowledge of why it is important to maintain a moderate to vigorous-intensity level over a longer period of time.


## **INTRAMURALS**

## **Dropping Students Off and Picking Students Up**

The morning and afternoon routines of dropping students off and picking them up from school has created some safety concerns for our students. We hope to mitigate these concerns with your support.

### Morning Drop-Off and Afternoon Pick-Up:

#### **Ash Street:**

- If you are stopping on the street without parking to drop off or pick up your children, please use the Stop, Drop and Go Zone on Ash St. heading northbound.
- When you arrive at the Stop, Drop and Go Zone, please turn your hazard lights on to indicate you are dropping off a child and pull to the side of the street. Have your child/children exit on the curbside.
- Please do not use the Stop, Drop and Go Zone if heading southbound on Ash St. We would like to discourage southbound trafficon
  Ash St. as much as possible, but should you find yourself heading southbound on Ash St. please pull over to park and ensure your
  child is safely able to cross the street.

#### Oak Street:


- Please do not stop to drop off or pick up your children on Oak St. as this is our school bus zone.
- If you need drop off or pick up your children on Oak St. please enter Oak St. from the Grosvenor intersection, park your vehicle in the direction of parked traffic and walk your child across the street.
- Please avoid using the staff parking lot and alley as a turn-around spot. Again, backing up in these spots creates a dangerous situation for young children crossing the street.

## Staff Parking Lot

• The staff parking lot is not to be used for student drop off or pick up. Many families walk through the parking lot to access the early years entry door and having vehicles pull in and back out creates a very dangerous situation.

We thank you for your cooperation and your continued support in keeping our students safe in and around the school.
