Robertson School is an inclusive community providing quality education for all students in a safe, caring environment from Nursery to Grade 6.

Our school prides itself on offering specialized and inclusive programming for students in the Life Skills and Autism Programs. Robertson School continues to embrace an inclusive school culture. When working on independent, group, or whole class activities, all students regardless of their ability are equitably involved in the learning process. A culture of professional learning has been cultivated over time that truly reflects our school belief that we are a "Community of Learners Working Together." Robertson school has approximately 360 students, 76 staff members, an active Parent Council, daily lunch program and a Before and After School Program. We are partners with our supportive parent community who are an integral part of the students' educational lives. Robertson School, as an inclusive education school, focuses on building on peoples' strengths. In this environment, all students develop self-worth and are provided with opportunities for meaningful involvement in learning. We work to ensure that every individual feels accepted and valued and safe.

#### **Priorities for 2021-22**

Student Mental Health and Self-Regulation

School-wide initiatives and programs focusing on stability, building connections and relationships with a wider range of students and staff through 'Family Groups', Split Grades (looping with the same teacher for 2 years), increasing high interest clubs, community involvement and celebrations and acceptance of diversity.

Indigenous Perspectives, the Calls to Action and Reconciliation

School-wide initiatives and programs focusing on infusing Indigenous education into our daily teaching practices, focusing on the Calls to Action, Reconciliation and culture.

 Assessment, Data, and Evidence of Student Learning (specifically Literacy and Numeracy) and Student Engagement

Teachers will focus on increasing student engagement by infusing effective curricular planning strategies through innovative practices such as Inquiry Based/Hands-on Learning, the Optimal Learning Model, Thinking Classrooms, STEM based learning and High Impact Teaching Strategies. In Professional Learning Communities (PLCs), teachers will focus on collaborative efforts to plan Learning Sprints using learning data to move learning forward.

Classroom teachers will continue to focus on academic inclusion, curricular adaptations, classroom environment and design, and ensuring that our students with exceptional needs are active participants in their learning.

Both a Numeracy Support Teacher and a Literacy Support Teacher will work with our team to support student learning and teacher efficacy in these areas.

The expansion of our exploration of the new ELA Curriculum Framework will be a priority specifically in the areas of inquiry based learning and effective teaching practices.

Students will continue to take ownership of their learning through demonstrating their understanding of what are they learning, why they are learning it, and how to assess their growth

## Parent and community involvement

This year, things constantly adapted to meet safety protocols due to COVID 19 and remote learning. We look forward to next year when more direct parent involvement in the school might be possible.

- Parent Volunteer provided valuable support of Mobile Vision Clinic, Picture Day, Hearing Screening, Immunizations.
- Parent-Council and the Robertson School community supported the purchase of recess equipment and grade 6 farewell supplies.
- Dedicated Parent-Council who make significant contributions to support our students and staff.
- Robertson School Lunch Program is a parent run program, which is governed by the Parent-Council. There are 18 staff and a coordinator supporting 335 students and their families.
