Robertson School continues to embrace an inclusive school culture. When working on independent, group, or whole class activities, all students regardless of their ability are equitably involved in the learning process. A culture of professional learning has been cultivated over time that truly reflects our school belief that we are a "Community of Learners Working Together." Robertson school has approximately 361 students, 58 staff members, an active Parent Council, daily lunch program and a Before and After School Program. We are partners with our supportive parent community who are an integral part of the students' educational lives. In this environment, all students develop self-worth and are provided with opportunities for meaningful involvement in learning. - We will represent, welcome and appreciate our diverse population through school and communitybased initiatives to further develop respectful relationships with each other and the natural world and foster home school partnerships.
- We will foster a sense of hope, belonging, meaning, and purpose to ensure students feel safe and supported at school.



More Highlights

- Staff & Student Volunteers provided valuable support of Mobile Vision Clinic, Picture Day, Hearing Screening, Immunizations, Bus Ridership, and Spring Concert.
- Robertson School community and Parent-Council supported the funding for classroom field trips, Grade 5/6 Farewell, treats for students, classroom supplies, etc.
- Dedicated Parent-Council who lead fundraisers such as the community BBQ, winter dance, Peak of the Market and Bagels which allow for the significant contributions to support our students and staff.
- Robertson School Lunch Program is a parent run program, which is governed by the Parent-Council. There are 14 staff and a coordinator supporting 260 students and their families.
