At the start of your child's day, they can line up by the doors at the southeast corner (near the shed). We will say goodbye to our families here, and walk inside as a class. Pickup will be outside at the same spot.

### Literacy

Literacy will be an important part of our day, every day. Students will engage in read alouds, small group alphabet and phonics centres, large group oral phonological awareness activities, and drawing/writing instruction at their own level. They will be assessed on their letter and sound knowledge several times throughout the year, so we can celebrate progress and plan next steps. Students may bring home learning activities to help support the learning we are doing in the classroom.

### Math

Math is a passion of mine, and will also be an important part of our day. Students will develop a solid foundation in number sense, and will work with numbers in a variety of ways (dot patterns, finger patterns, ten frames, number sentences, etc.). They will also engage in activities related to patterning, problem solving, counting, and other areas through whole group instruction, stories, songs, and games.
