

# SafeArrival for Families FAO

### What is SafeArrival?

SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence.

You are asked to report your child's absence in advance whenever possible using one of these convenient methods:

### SchoolMessenger app (free)

- 1. Provide your email address to the school.
- 2. Get the app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at
- https://qo.schoolmessenger.ca).

  3. Tap Sign Up to create your account.
- 4. Select Attendance from the menu, and then select Report an Absence.

### Web and Mobile Web: go.schoolmessenger.ca

- Provide your email address to the school.
- Go to the website.
   Click Sign Up to create your account.
- 4. Select Attendance from the menu, then select Report an Absence

### Interactive Toll-free Phone 1-855-278-4513

- Call the toll-free, interactive telephone system.
- Follow the instructions to report an absence.
- 3. Record the confirmation number at the end of the call.

If you hang up before this is given the absence will be cancelled and will not be reported to the Whenever an absence is reported or updated, you will receive a confirmation notice by email (assuming you have provided your contact information to the school).

If you don't report your child's absence in advance, the automated notification system will try to contact you (using the communication preferences if you have set them up in the SchoolMessenger app). This may include push notifications to the app, email, phone calls. You will be asked to provide the reason for your child's absence immediately. You may do so using the phone line, website or mobile app.

If an absence is not explained within approximately 20 minutes of the time that the school starts the notification process, school staff will follow-up to make sure that your child is safe. If you try to explain an absence using SafeArrival, but are then told that it is past the cut-off time, please contact the school directly.

If you don't want to receive notifications when your child is absent, be sure to report your child's absence in advance.

If you do receive notifications of your child's absence, be sure to provide the reason as quickly as possible, using one of the 3 methods listed above or during the phone call notification itself.

### Absences can be reported in advance:

- 24 hours/day
- 7 days a week
- For any school day in the school term
- Up to the cut-off time on the day of the absence

# What is SafeArrival?

SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for you to let the school know about your child's absence. Please take note if you have not put your child's absence in the system before the school sends out the calls, you will get a call from the system.

Transportation clerks also inform families when busses are cancelled through School Messenger so it is very important for families to provide their child's school with an updated email address and/or cell phone number.

Please make sure you are keeping your home phone number, email and contact information up to date with the school. You can call the office at 204-786-3469.

Dear Parents, Guardians, Caregivers and Families,

Welcome to a new school year! We are looking forward to welcoming our students back to school next week and are writing to provide you with some information. We hope that you will have an opportunity to review them with your child:

**1. Daily Schedule:** Students may be dropped off at 8:45 a.m. and are expected to enter the building and be in their classroom by 8:55 a.m.

Nursery & Kindergarten students dismiss at 11:30 a.m. or 3:30 p.m. and Grades 1 to 6 students dismiss for lunch at 12:00 p.m. and will resume their afternoon classes at 1:00 p.m.

Note: Students going home for lunch may return at 12:55 p.m. End of the day school dismissal for students is at 3:30 p.m. The students will be walked outside by their classroom teacher to the school's hardtop. Please refer to page 2 of the September newsletter for further details.

**2. Entering and Exiting the Building:** The Mulvey School Elevator Project has continued over the summer months and is very near completion, with access to enter and exit through the back Woodrow Avenue southeast doors taking place sometime in September. The Mulvey School bus students will still be picked up and dropped off at the southwest Woodrow Place doors. Bus students will use these doors to enter and exit the building. There will be educational assistants assigned to facilitate. The 750 Wolseley Avenue Mulvey School front doors will be used for entering and exiting the school. The Bike racks have been moved back into the bike storage cage to the southeast side of the building for the students to access. Please note, the bike rack is locked from 9:05 AM - 3:25 PM unless the student asks the office to have the bike cage unlocked. Students are also to lock their bikes in the bike cage with their own locks, and the bike cage will also be locked. For entry to the school office, please ring using the entry phone system by pressing the bell symbol, for the office to welcome you in. Bus students will continue to use the South West Woodrow Place doors and come directly into the school via the Mulvey School sidewalk leading to Woodrow Place West Doors. We are very fortunate that the Province of Manitoba and the Winnipeg School Division have upgraded our school building to be full accessible with an elevator and a lift. To access the elevator please use the Woodrow Place southeast doors.

- **3. Appointments and meetings at school:** If you require an appointment with an administrator or teacher, please phone the main school office at 204-786-3469.
- **4. Student Drop off and Pickup:** The Loop (located just off Wolseley Avenue) is available for vehicles to drop off and pick up the students. Please reference the Loop information in the September 2023 newsletter page 7. Parking on Wolseley Avenue and running across the street is not safe. Please note that there is a crosswalk available to use a few metres West of the school entrance on Wolseley Avenue. Please abide by traffic laws and signage.
- **5. Healthy Practices:** While facemasks are no longer required, if your child chooses to wear a mask, they will be made available at the school. Handwashing practices will be promoted and available throughout the school day for students at various sink areas throughout the school to promote the Health and Wellness of everyone.

We remain focussed on the health and safety of all students, families and staff. It is still recommended that if anyone is ill to remain home to reduce the spread of any possible illness. We appreciate everyone's cooperation and understanding. Students should return to school when feeling better and clear of symptoms. We will continue to follow and adhere to all Provincial Mandates and Protocols. We will still utilize the Wellness Room when students present with symptoms and illness and are waiting to be picked up.

- **6. Lunch Kits:** We also continue to encourage lunch kits that can be re-used daily by the students to reduce waste. We will continue to promote, as much as possible, waste free lunch packaging and will once again promote and expand our very successful Wasteless Wednesdays Initiative. Please have students label their bags and all contents, supplies at the school. Please be reminded it is always helpful to discretely label your child's articles of clothing should they end up in the lost and found.
- **7. School Fees:** Reminder that the school supply fees are due during the first week of school and are payable to the classroom teacher. Receipts will be issued.
- **8. Lunch Program Fees:** If your child participates in the school's lunch program, fees are payable at the school office. Receipts will be issued.
- **9. Classes Start:** All Grades 1-6 students including the Autism Program will start on Wednesday, September 4th. Students in Nursery and Kindergarten have received an appointment time to meet their teacher, in the weeks of September 4-6 and will start on Monday, September 9th.

Orange Shirt Day Every Child Matters

Wear orange in support of Every Child Matters. All children deserve an opportunity to have security, education and good health. Orange Shirt Day is an important day when WSD Schools, educators, students and school communities honour the residential school survivors and remember those that didn't make it home. Orange Shirt Day is an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

The Province of Manitoba will recognize Indigenous culture and remember residential school survivors as part of Orange Shirt Day on September 30th. Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of Phyllis' story of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all

aspects of residential schools happening annually. The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an

opportunity to set the stage for antiracism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations.

We will provide further details in the next few weeks.




# **Lunch Program News**



We do not keep cash in the school, so it is very helpful if you bring exact change to make any payments. Please note the school does not accept cheques.


We encourage parents and students to make any after school arrangements ahead of time, to reduce number of phone calls, safety of students and traffic in the office.

# Some tips for parents:

**Talk about it.** Discuss text and pictures before you read and encourage your child to predict what the story is about.

**Make your point.** Running your fingers under the words helps children see that text runs left to right. Encourage them to look for the letters of their name.



**Rhyme play every day**. Rhyme play is one of the most effective tools for young readers.

**Be a book buddy.** Read at home with your children every day – books, magazines and newspapers are all good.



Stick to reading together even when your children can read on their own. Choose books you can read together that challenge thinking and open the door to discussion.

"Read" by example. Talk about what you're reading as well. Newspapers and magazines count too!

**Check out the library**. In your city, town or school – libraries have something for everyone.



Check in at your school. Talk to your children's teachers about reading programs and resources that may be available at your school.



# **Vision Testing for Mulvey School Students**

Mulvey School is excited to share the news that all Mulvey Students from

Nursery – Grade 6 will have access to having their vision tested this school year, if they were not tested this calendar year and require testing. The Vision screening will be provided by the Mobile Vision Care Clinic who carries out this valuable service throughout the year at various WSD Schools. Mulvey School is working with the Mobile Vision Care Clinic to provide the vision testing.



The students will have their eyes examined for vision and eye health by a licensed optometrist at the school.

Good vision is a crucial part of a student's ability to learn and flourish, we strive to ensure that all students at Mulvey are provided with the resources and supports to optimize their learning.

In order to have your child(ren) eyes tested by the Optometrist, we are asking that all students have the **Eye Examination Consent Form completed and returned back to school.** (Please note the form is double sided.)

As a part of the Mobile Vision Care Clinic, Students will receive a free eye examination and those who require glasses will receive the glasses free of charge if no insurance or coverage is available to the family.

Please complete one form per child and ensure that the Student Eye Examination Consent Form is in to the school office. It would be wonderful to have all Mulvey Students participate in this free, generous and extremely important initiative! # Security Cameras in Schools



Keeping our students, staff, parents and visitors safe in Winnipeg School Division schools is a top priority. One way we do this is by monitoring areas in schools (eg. entrances, hallways and school buses) using security cameras.

Security cameras are used to monitor WSD property to assist in detecting and deterring unacceptable behavior or activities, and to assist investigations when required. WSD has put in place a detailed policy about the collection, use, protection, retention and/or disclosure of information captured on security cameras with the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Personal Privacy Act (FIPPA), the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA), the Youth Criminal Justice Act, as well as WSD Policy EGC – Records Management and Retention.


