# Return to School 2023 – 2024

Welcome to a new school year. We will still use designated doors to help with movement in and out of the school.

Nursery and Kindergarten will continue to use the front doors off of Torwood Crescent.

Grade 1 & 2 will continue to use the Bus Loop Doors off of the Lucas Avenue entrance.

Grades 3 to 6 will continue to use the Chisholm Drive doors.

Families can drop off all children at one door if easier for the family. Older siblings can enter with the younger sibling if needed.

Please use caution and follow all traffic laws to ensure students are safe during drop off and pick up times.

Start of school is 8:55 AM when the bell rings students will enter the school.

Nursery & Kindergarten dismiss at 11:30 AM

Grades 1 to 6 will dismiss for lunch at 12:00 PM and return at 12: 55 PM

Note: Students going home for lunch area not to return before 12:55 PM. End of School is 3:30 PM

## Student Accident Insurance

The Student Accident Forms will be sent home. Please note that this insurance offers excellent coverage for a very low cost. I wish to emphasize the importance of ensuring that you have coverage for emergency situations. If a child is injured at school and we feel that the child requires immediate medical attention, an ambulance is contacted as well as the parent. The cost of the ambulance is borne by the parent.

It is helpful for families to have insurance for such a contingency if that support is not available to the parent under other medical coverage.

## HEALTH CONCERNS

If your child has any health concerns, for example, an EPIPEN, puffer, or medication, please inform the office so we can be prepared to act promptly if required. Parents who wish the school to administer medication must get a form from the school office for their doctor to

complete. All medication is to be left in the school office. It is the parent's responsibility to refill prescriptions and to notify the office if there is a change in the medication.

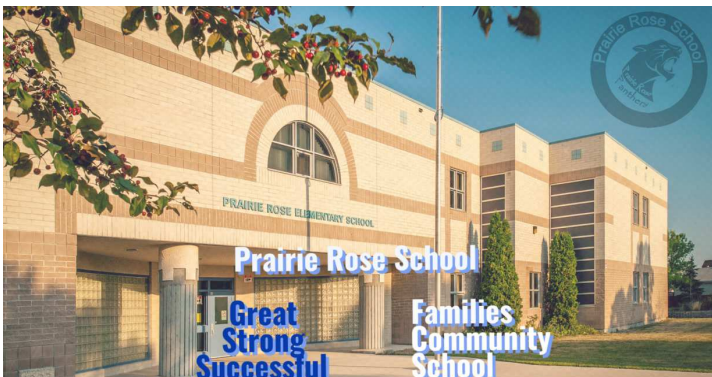

Please note that all students who are not in attendance at school during any given day, are part of the school-wide call back system. Teachers report the names of children who are absent, and if the parent of the absent child has not called the Safe Arrival Call In System at 1-855-278-4513 to report their absence, they will be notified by phone at their home or workplace regarding the student's absence by the automated system. They will continue to be called every 5 minutes until they verify the absence. In order to ensure the safety of our students, it is imperative that parents/guardians notify the school of any absences or late arrivals. Students who arrive at school late are instructed to report to the office first before going to their classrooms.

## HOME INFORMATION UPDATES

If, at anytime during the school year, your **HOME INFORMATION, work and any other contact telephone numbers change, please let the office know as soon as possible.**

This information is vital in the case of an emergency, if your child is injured or becomes ill. Current home and work (as well as cell) telephone numbers are necessary to ensure that you, or your emergency contact person can be reached.

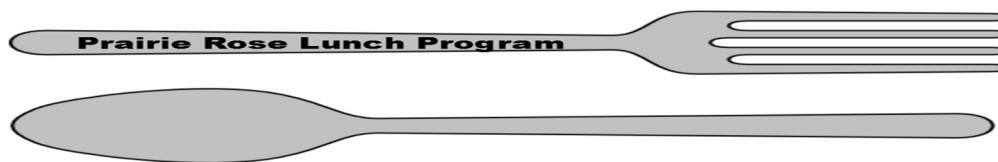
The Winnipeg School Division is happy to announce the hiring of a new Chief Superintendent and CEO Mr. Matt Henderson.

Drop-In (cash) \$2.50 per day includes milk.

Children must be pre-registered for Drop-In service.

We ask that you pay either by:

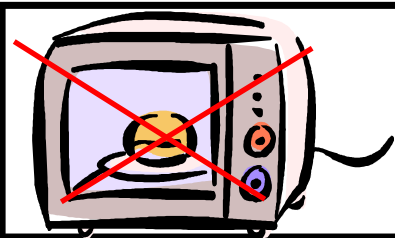
- Ten post-dated cheques

## Security and Safety

Please be aware that Prairie Rose School and the school grounds are continually monitored by video cameras. This is for the security and safety of all students, staff and the Prairie Rose School community.

### Security Cameras in Schools



Keeping our students, staff, parents and visitors safe in Winnipeg School Division schools is a top priority. One way we do this is by monitoring areas in schools (eg. entrances, hallways and school buses) using security cameras.

Security cameras are used to monitor WSD property to assist in detecting and deterring unacceptable behavior or activities, and to assist investigations when required. WSD has put in place a detailed policy about the collection, use, protection, retention and/or disclosure of information captured on security cameras with the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Personal Privacy Act (FIPPA), the Personal Health Information Act (PHIA), the Youth Criminal Justice Act, as well as WSD Policy EGC – Records Management and Retention.

The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of “Every Child Matters”. The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

## Buses & Transportation

### Bus cancellation

During the school year there may be times when school bus transportation is cancelled due to inclement weather or poor driving conditions, but schools will remain open.

School bus transportation for all school divisions in the City of Winnipeg is cancelled when the temperature reaches  $-35^{\circ}\text{C}$  or colder by 6:15 a.m. based on the Environment Canada readings in Winnipeg. When bus transportation is cancelled in the morning, it will not resume later in the day even if weather conditions improve. All major Winnipeg media outlets are contacted in the early morning and are asked that they broadcast and/or post bus cancellation information.

### Severe Weather Conditions

Severe weather conditions and poor roads may extend the running time of some buses, resulting in late arrival and departure. Parents/guardians should make sure that children are suitably clothed until picked up and that they have a place to go in the event the bus does not arrive. Parents/guardians must also ensure that children have a place to go after the return trip.

## Home Reading

Here are 5 tips to encourage reading at home:

1.) Set Aside a Special Reading Time and Place – Find a cozy reading nook, comfy couch, or snuggle in bed. Having a special place and time to read makes reading part of family time. Children will come to look forward to this time.

2.) The Power of Picture Books – The possibilities are endless when a child looks at the illustrations of a wordless book and uses their imagination to create their own story! Just think of the vocabulary and expression children will use as they communicate the adventure. This process also helps young children flex their imaginations and develop oral language skills.

3.) Rhyme Time – Rhymes help young children notice and hear sounds within words, an essential skill for reading. While driving, grocery shopping or cooking dinner, you and your child can challenge each other to rhyme words. You may be surprised to find how much your child loves challenging you! Nursery rhymes and rhyming books can help young children not only hear the rhyme, but also see patterns in the words.

4.) Host a Reading Party! – Combine food, fun and reading! Host a party where children read a book and illustrate the story through a creative avenue such as a play, song or drawing. A “Popcorn, Pizza and Poetry Party” or “S’mores and Scary Stories Party” can be a fun opportunity that even the most reluctant reader can’t turn down.

5.) Technology, Tweens and Teens – Having difficulty engaging your tweens and teens in reading? Teens are social beings — using technology to connect with other readers, discussing books through author blogs or joining book clubs may help inspire teenage readers.
