STUDENTS TURNING 18 YEARS OF AGE

Parents are reminded that once a student turns 18, we require a waiver signed by the student to enable us to provide information to parents regarding the learning of the student.

Waivers are mailed home the month before the student turns 18. Please talk to your child about this requirement before their 18th birthday.

SAFE ARRIVAL

To enhance our existing absence-checking procedure, Tec-Voc is using a student absence reporting system called Safe Arrival. Safe Arrival will make it easy for you to report your child's absence.

Parents/Guardians are asked to report their child(rens) absence in advance using any of these 3 methods:

- Using your cell phone, download and install the SchoolMessenger app from the Apple Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca>). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- Use the SafeArrival website, <https://go.schoolmessenger.ca>. The first time you use the website, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- Call the toll-free number 1-855-278-4513 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time. Thank you for your patience and cooperation.

Restorative practices can help strengthen relationships among students, families, and staff when concerns arise at school.

Let's work together to resolve matters and make sure everyone has a safe learning environment.

Speak with your child about the situation to gain their perspective.



2

Contact the classroom teacher. Teachers are directly involved with students and offer the best insight.

3

If concerns are not addressed, reach out to the school principal for support.



4

For ongoing issues, call the Superintendent's Department at 204-775-0231. Indicate the school you are calling about. WSD leadership will respond.

5

If challenges persist, contact the Board and Community Liaison Officer at 204-789-0469. They work with families and the Board of Trustees to reach a solution.
