SAFETY FIRST



When dropping off or picking up children, please observe the **No Stopping** and **No Parking** signs posted around the school.

Please also don't block driveways in the back lane or park or stop in the bus zone, accessible parking (unless you have a valid permit) or in staff's parking spots.

Please make sure to screen your children for signs of illness before sending them to school. To keep everyone healthy, the expectation is that children who are sick need to be at home.

NUTS and SEAFOOD AWARE SCHOOL

There are students and staff who attend our school who have severe life-threatening allergies to either NUTS or SEAFOOD, so we are reminding you **not to send these in you child's lunches.**

SAFETY

As always, our school will be practicing our emergency preparedness plan. All schools are mandated to have a safety intervention plan in the event of unsafe situations.

Being prepared for an emergency, and knowing how to respond appropriately and calmly should one occur, helps to reassure frightened students and staff.

Every school year we practice 3 Lockdown Drills, 3 Hold and Secure Drills, 1 or 2 Evacuation Drills and 10 Fire Drills

A reminder that our evacuation site is Andrew Mynarski VC School. Our secondary evacuation site is Sinclair Community Club.

WELCOME TO ROBERTSON SCHOOL

This handbook is intended to acquaint you with the school, its staff, programs, policies and procedures. Please keep this as a handy reference guide and if you have any questions, do not hesitate to call the school at 204-589-4745.

At Robertson School, we believe that everyone is valued and interconnected. Rooted in The Winnipeg School Division's vision of Joy, Love, and Rigour, we provide a safe, inclusive environment for approximately 350 students from Nursery to Grade 6.

Our 65 staff members deliver specialized, strength-based programming that supports diverse learners through inquiry-based approaches. Students are engaged in meaningful learning that fosters curiosity, collaboration, and critical thinking.

Equity and diversity are celebrated in our school community. We strive to ensure all students feel seen, respected, and supported in a space that honours their identities and lived experiences.

Student well-being and mental health are central to our work. Dedicated sensory and regulation spaces—including the Movement Room, The Den, The Cave, and Sensory Room—help students develop self-regulation skills in a calm, supportive environment.

Staff collaborate continuously to grow professionally and respond to student needs. We value our partnerships with families and community organizations, including Inspired by Wonder Inc., and appreciate the support of our Parent Council in strengthening connections between home and school.

At Robertson, we create a culture of belonging where every student feels confident, capable, and inspired to learn with joy and purpose. We hope that you and your family will become actively involved in the Robertson School Community of Learners. When we work in partnership, your children's educational experiences will be both enriching and positive.

There is a parent council and we encourage all parents to become members of the parent council or to help out at the many events they organize throughout the school year.

SCHOOL HOURS:

The school office is open from 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Monday to Friday.

School day for :

Grades 1 to 6:	8:55 a.m. - 3:25 p.m. (Lunch Hour 11:55 a.m.-12:55 p.m.)
AM Nursery and Kindergarten classes	8:55 a.m - 11:25 a.m
PM Nursery and Kindergarten classes	12:55 p.m - 3:25 p.m

The school schedule follows a six day cycle. Parents will be provided with the six day schedule at the beginning of each school year.

ARRIVAL AT SCHOOL:

The playground area by the play structure is supervised from 8:40 – 8:55 a.m. and from 12:50 – 12:55 p.m. Students who arrive early are expected to remain outside in that area until the bell rings. During inclement weather, the duty supervisors will allow students to stand inside the entrances. The bell rings for students to enter at 8:50 a.m. and 12:50 p.m.

CELL PHONE PROCEDURE:

As per the direction put forth by the Minister of Education and Early Childhood Learning, Kindergarten to Grade 8 students are not permitted to use cell phones during school hours, including breaks and lunch.

Students who bring a cell phone to school have two options for storing their device during the school day: they may store their phone in their locker or hand it to their classroom teacher for secure storage until the end of the school day at 3:25 p.m. Students will not have access to their phones during breaks or at lunch.

Please note that **student lockers are not locked**. Students who choose to store their cell phone in their locker are responsible for the security of their device. **The Winnipeg School Division is not responsible for cell phones that are lost, damaged, or stolen while on school property, including cell phones stored in student lockers.** Students who would like their phone securely stored during the school day may choose to give it to their classroom teacher.

We appreciate students' cooperation in following these expectations and helping us maintain a focused, safe, and positive learning environment. Students are expected to follow the school's cell phone expectations at all times. If a student is found using their cell phone during the school day, the teacher will respectfully remove the phone and securely store it until 3:25 p.m.

For a second offense, the student's parent/guardian will be contacted and asked to come to the school to pick up the phone directly from the teacher.

If you need to contact your child during the school day, please contact the school office at 204-589-4745. We appreciate your support in helping us ensure that students remain engaged in their learning and that our school environment remains positive and focused.

RECESS:

Recess times are at 10: 25 a.m. -10:40 a.m. and 2:25 p.m.—2:40 p.m.

Recess is held indoors when the weather is unsuitable. The Winnipeg School Division has cold weather guidelines for schools and when the temperature with wind chill is lower than -27, the children will have indoor recess.

STAFF MEETINGS / PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT DAYS:

Regular staff meetings are held on the **first Tuesday of each month**.

Teachers require opportunities to expand their knowledge and training in order to implement new curricula and directions emerging from the school division and the Manitoba Education, Citizenship and Youth Department. Thus, throughout the year, there will also be days designated for school wide professional development for the staff. On these days, the classes will not be in session and parents will be notified in advance of the dates and times of these days in our monthly newsletter.

Please update your email or phone numbers with our school office if there are any changes.

SCHOOL FORMS:

In October of every school year, you will be asked to complete a student information form. It is important to keep our information up to date and any changes that occur during the year should be reported to the school.

In the event of any serious injury to your child (cuts, sprains, breaks, concussion) which might need medical attention, you will be notified immediately. Therefore, it is imperative that your telephone numbers are accurate and current. Please notify us of any changes as soon as possible.

PROCEDURE FOR PARENT CONCERNS:

What do you do when you have a concern? Should there be a concern, **first try to solve it with your child's teacher**. If unresolved, contact the principal or vice-principal.

FIELD TRIPS:

Field trips are important and provide curriculum based experiences for students. Notification of pertinent details and a permission form for the parents/guardians to sign will be sent home before each outing. **We will need parent volunteers to help supervise on field trips. Please ensure you have filled out volunteer forms well in advance. Call the school office to ask for the appropriate forms.**

REPORT CARDS AND STUDENT LED CONFERENCES:

Report cards are issued three times per year during the months of **November, March and June**. In November we will be having Parent Teacher Conferences and March Student-led conferences are held. These conferences encourage students to be responsible and accountable for their learning, their effort and their behavior. They give students the chance to look back on what they have or haven't accomplished during the term. In these conferences, your child, together with the teacher, can identify areas of strength and challenges, describe goals for the next term and the things s/he and the teacher will do to achieve those goals.

FIRE DRILLS, HOLD & SECURE, LOCKDOWN DRILLS and EVACUATION DRILLS:

All schools must have :

- At least ten fire drills during the school year. During these drills, the students learn to exit the building quickly and safely.
- At least three hold & secure and lockdown drills (one each term). During these drills, students learn how to behave safely in emergency situations where there might be an emergency outside or inside the building.
- At least one evacuation drill to our evacuation site at AMVC Junior High.

LUNCH PROGRAM:

Students have the opportunity to stay for lunch at Robertson School.

Students are supervised inside the school from 11:55-12:25 and then outside on the playground from 12:25-12:55. Children in the lunch program are not permitted to leave the school grounds during school hours unless there is a written request from parents. To be a part of lunch program, appropriate and respectful behaviour is expected from the students at all times during the lunch hour. We ask that students bring their own lunch and parents refrain from sending any snacks or foods that contain nuts/tree nuts, seafood or fish as a number of our students have severe allergies.

SEPTEMBER/OCTOBER MEANS...

BUS RIDERSHIP:

The bus ridership program happens twice yearly; once in the fall and once in the spring. Students are instructed in the proper and safe way of traveling on school busses.

SCHOOL PICTURES:

Pictures of individual Robertson students will be taken by Edge Imaging in the fall and class pictures will happen in the spring. All students will be photographed. Please notify your child's teacher if you do not want an individual picture taken of your child. Re-takes are also available for those who require them. Grade 6 'farewell' photos are done in the spring.

MEET THE TEACHER:

Each September on the Tuesday before school starts, the school has an open house ***Meet the Teacher*** event at the school. Parents have an opportunity to learn about classroom programs and meet the teachers in an informal atmosphere.

PATROLS:

Each year approximately 40 grade 5 and 6 students provide safe crossings for Robertson students traveling to and from school. Patrols are trained and supervised by staff members throughout the year.

Additionally, the grade 3 and 4 students support the N/K classrooms with helping get the students ready for the day and leaving school at the end of the day.

GRADE 3-6 LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITIES:

Students will be able to participate in many leadership opportunities throughout the school year including but not limited to: ESD, N/K Patrols, student council, conflict managers, library helpers, den helpers, etc.

PLAYGROUND AND PLAY STRUCTURE:

Robertson parent council provided the school with a beautiful play structure which is enjoyed by students during school hours and the community in the evenings. During school hours, staff provides supervision at recess times and lunch room supervisors supervise the children after lunch. Supervision is also provided at 8:40 a.m. until the bell rings at 8:50 a.m. It is expected that students leave the school grounds promptly at 3:25 p.m. There is no after school supervision.

HOME READING:

Many classrooms at Robertson School have a home reading program whereby students take home a book each day. This book is to be read to the child by the parent or the book is read to the parent by the child. We strongly believe that daily reading is a necessity for a successful school experience and the staff at Robertson School promote and encourage this. Please take the time each day to read to your child or have your child read to you.

We consider home reading to be homework.

COMMUNICATION:

Each month a school newsletter is sent home electronically. These newsletters inform parents of school activities and also include a monthly calendar to help parents make note of special activities and school closings. Other notices are also sent home via school messenger, email and occasionally a hard copy with your child. Please ensure you check emails regularly **we suggest that backpacks be checked daily for home reading, and any notices that may have been handed out for that day**. Also, visit our school website for up to date information and links to our social media accounts.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOURAL INTERVENTIONS & SUPPORTS (PBIS):

PBIS is a system of support for defining, teaching, and supporting appropriate student behaviors to create a positive school environment. The purpose of school-wide PBIS is to establish a climate in which appropriate behavior is the norm and that common language and expectations are known and used.

PBIS helps students by defining very clearly the desired behaviors in each part of the school, by training students in these behaviors, by rewarding positive behavior and by gathering data on challenging areas in order to work on targeted solutions.

After each natural break (Beginning of School, after Winter Break and after Spring Break) staff and students will go visit each common area to be reminded of school expectations. Students can ask any questions they have to the designated adult.

The goal of PBIS at Robertson School is to establish the behavioral supports needed for all students to achieve social, emotional and academic success, and to become positive members of the school community.

At Robertson School, our three pillars for expected behaviours are:

BE RESPECTFUL

BE RESPONSIBLE

BE SAFE

PROGRAMMING:

Robertson School follows the Manitoba curricula which includes the following:

- Language Arts
- Mathematics
- Science
- Social Studies
- Art
- Health
- Music
- Performing Arts
- Physical Education
- Technology

All programs follow the curriculum guides as published by the Manitoba Department of Education, Training and Youth.

Robertson School also offers the following programs:

- Literacy Support/Numeracy Support Teachers- support service designed to assist students experiencing learning difficulties or needing enrichment; teachers who will collaborate, co-teach, and support the classroom students and teachers.
- Learning Support/Inclusion Support Teachers– teachers who will collaborate, co-teach, and support the classroom students with exceptional needs and their teachers.
- Extra-curricular activities - run on a voluntary basis by the staff and can occur before school, during the lunch hour and/or after school.
