Highlights

2025-2026 was a fantastic school year at Tyndall Park. There were a wide variety of extra curricular activities, tons of learning, a drama production and students were working side by side in their learning. The school leadership also changed! Mr. Erichsen was appointed the principal of Tyndall Park and a new vice-principal, Mr. Erickson, was brought on board.

A wide variety of extra curricular activities were available to students during the day including drama club, running club, skating club, and board games club. Tyndall Park is lucky to have staff who put in the energy and time to offer such a diverse set of additional experiences to our students. Students also participated in a variety of sports including volleyball, softball soccer and the fit run.

This year our student leadership group planned and delivered our very first student wellness day. Students planned for movement, snacks, reflective time and games. This is a wonderful example of students getting involved and taking charge of their own learning.

Tyndall Park is committed to reconciliation, and as part of this commitment a group of students and staff regularly smudged at the school. Smudge is available for students from grade 4-6 and includes cultural teachings, opportunities to connect in a positive way with peers, and a supportive atmosphere for all participants. Students also recognized important days of reflection including Orange Shirt Day and Red Dress Day.

Teaching staff continued to be committed to provide the best possible education to every child in Tyndall Park. This year staff co-created a 3-year plan for Tyndall Park School to support Literacy, Mathematics and Community goals. This plan is visible to all on our welcoming board at the entrance to the school.

Our community and parents help make Tyndall Park a special school. Turnout for parent teacher meetings and student led conferences was fantastic and we had parent representatives attend North District Parent advisory meetings. The meetings give opportunity for parent reps to advocate for their community schools needs and to have a voice in decision making at the divisional level. Parent council held monthly meetings to help inform the school and helped to initiate a highly successful Kernels popcorn fundraiser and hot lunch fundraisers.

Tyndall Park also hosted beehives on the roof. Students were able to learn about the life of bees, how honey is collected and taste the honey that came from Tyndall hives.
