Adventure to the Arctic! Kelvin Students Explore Churchill, Manitoba!

This November, Kelvin High School students had the incredible opportunity to travel to Churchill, Manitoba, as part of the annual NorthStar trip. The journey offered a chance to experience the wonders of the North while contributing to important research on polar bears.

The primary focus of the trip was to gather usable photos and data for polar bear research, particularly for analyzing their body condition and attempting to catalog them. Of course, the polar bears were a highlight of the trip, but the students enjoyed many other memorable experiences along the way.

The group was given a guided tour by the Churchill Junior Rangers and explored the historic site of Cape Merry on the shores of Hudson Bay. They attended a fascinating presentation on the Sayisi Dene people and the rich Indigenous history of the region. The students also went dog sledding, where some were even lucky enough to feed the delightfully friendly Gray Jay birds.

The adventure continued with a ride on the famous Tundra Buggies, which took the group through Wapusk National Park in search of polar bears. The students were thrilled to witness bears sparring—a rare and breathtaking sight. In addition to observing these majestic creatures, they successfully captured multiple photos for their research, even though identifying individual bears remains challenging. (After all, polar bears don't wear name tags, and they all share the same snowy white coat!)

The trip concluded on a perfect note. While cloudy skies obscured the aurora borealis during the first few nights, the final evening brought clear skies, revealing a dazzling display of the northern lights—a truly magical way to end the adventure.

As exciting as the trip was, we know many readers are eager to see the photos taken during this journey. Some of the images have been included here, and we encourage you to try identifying whether any of the photos feature the same bear. This fun exercise highlights the importance of developing a reliable identification method for studying polar bears.





Kelvin Remembers

École secondaire Kelvin High School held an advance Remembrance Day service on Nov. 8, coinciding with Indigenous Veterans Day. Premier Wab Kinew spoke at the service, detailing his trip to Normandy, France this past June for the 80th anniversary of the D-Day landings during the Second World War. On June 6, 1944, approximately 14,000 Canadians from the 3rd Canadian Infantry Division and the 2nd Canadian Armoured Brigade landed at Juno Beach as part of the Allied invasion of German-occupied France. There were 1,096 Canadian casualties on D-Day, including 381 soldiers and airmen who were killed in action. "It's one of the most pivotal moments in the Second World War," said Kinew in his speech. "...the pivotal moments that give us the life we enjoy here in Canada today."

A Kelvin Holiday Breakfast Tradition!

On December 6th, we hosted our 25th annual Holiday Breakfast for the students of Fort Rouge Elementary School. 193 excited students were welcomed with a breakfast of pancakes, hash browns, sausages, banana bread, fruit and juice. Hall of Honuor Highlights Local Heros' Legacies

Kelvin history teacher Christopher Young is committed to making Remembrance Day meaningful for students and the school community.

On Nov. 6, he and the Kelvin History Club presented the Hall of Honour, a bilingual display highlighting 291 Kelvin alumni who died in the First and Second World Wars. Almost 3,000 Kelvin students served in the two conflicts. "I think it's key that students connect with the personal stories of the soldiers, because if not, it's just a number," Young said. "It's important that students can relate to the lives these young people livedlearning about their families, their hobbies, and where they grew up."

Grade 11 student Hawa Gelle, who worked on the Hall of Honour, found the experience inspiring. "I was in complete awe," she said. "With the Kelvin History Club, we wanted to tell those stories and shed light on how kids our age did admirable things for our country."


