WINNIPEG SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA (Grades 1 to 12)

The WSO has programs available for students in Grades 1 to 12. For more information on the programs and dates, please visit www.wso.ca.

Information and order forms will be distributed directly to elementary schools with respect to the Musical Discoveries and Adventures in Music Series. These programs have an application deadline so that a portion of funds can be allocated to the high schools for the WSO Student Matinees.

WINNIPEG CONTEMPORARY DANCERS (K to Grade 12)

Contemporary Dancers performances are available in two different shows, one for elementary schools and one for high schools.

Students will see how the dancers train first thing in the morning, then there is a repertoire part of the show where work is highlighted from both provincial and national choreographers. In between the works, the dancers will do warm up and even some audience participation where some students can join in on stage and experience some fun simple exercises.

The in-school performances run approximately one hour long, with an introduction/demonstration, performance Q&A period. A good-sized gym with a clean, warm floor is needed as the dancers will be barefoot.

ROYAL WINNIPEG BALLET (K to Grade 12)

The Concert Hour Ballet is a one-hour program, featuring senior RWB students, to share the power of dance with other school-aged students. This program has the dual goal of introducing students to the art form and allowing professional dance students to experience the demands of performing and touring first-hand.

The school's touring program also provides important opportunities for artist commissions and workshops that provide reconciliation with Indigenous peoples and foster women, two-spirit and/or genderqueer choreographic voices.

RWB also incorporates Sharing Dance workshops into the tours to encourage and increase audience participation and engagement. A good-sized gym is needed for in-school performances.

MANITOBA OPERA (Grades 7 to 12)

Student Night at the Opera presents Rossini's La Cenerentola (Cinderella), to be held on Thursday, November 10, 2022, at 7:30pm. (Student tickets are at no cost and limited and will be provided on a first request basis by contacting the Superintendents' Dept.) This is a fully staged opera.

Performance takes place at the Centennial Concert Hall; tickets are at no cost and limited to the first 200 students. **Students are responsible for their own transportation.**

MANITOBA CHAMBER ORCHESTRA (K to Grade 12)

Complementary matinee tickets will be provided for four in-person matinees which includes Interactive Learning Guides for student groups. (Student tickets are limited and will be provided on a first request basis by contacting the Superintendents' Dept.)

FREEZE FRAME (K to Grade 12)

Freeze Frame is an International Film Festival for Kids of All Ages will once again be featuring award winning films from around the world, with options suitable for all grade levels in English, Immersion and French Milieu classes.

In-Person Programming is held at the Centre Culturel Franco Manitobain. The first 1,000 students registered are free (maximum number of 100 students per school. After 100 students, school must pay \$3.50 per student.) Teachers are always FREE! The festival will take place March 5-12, 2023.

ARTS COMMUNITY ENRICHMENT ACTIVITIES

QUANTUM ARTS (GRADES 5 TO 12) - A CHILDREN'S HERITAGE FUND PROJECT

The WSD Quantum Arts Program is financially supported by the Children's Heritage Fund as an enrichment activity to provide students the opportunity to work with professional actors, dancers and artists at one of two organizations: Winnipeg Film Group and the Winnipeg Art Gallery. The program provides an opportunity for schools to select students with the interest and abilities in the arts to learn and work directly with local community arts organizations.

The Quantum Arts Program will enable a total of 58 students to attend one of the participating programs. To help in planning, a sign of interest in taking part in this Program is required by all schools with Grades 5 to 12 by Friday, October 7, 2022. QUANTUM – WINNIPEG ART GALLERY (Grades 5 to 8)

This program is to further develop the artmaking skills of Quantum students. The students will be introduced to a variety of 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional art mediums (such as drawing, painting, clay and mixed media). They will be encouraged to explore each of these materials and techniques and expand their skills and imaginations while working on individual projects. The projects are theme based and encourage students to think deeply on the subject of their study and apply a visual approach to self-expression. QUANTUM – WINNIPEG ART GALLERY (Grades 9 to 12)

This program is to further develop the artmaking skills of Quantum students. The students will be introduced to a variety of 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional art mediums (such as drawing, painting, clay and mixed media). They will be encouraged to explore each of these materials and techniques, expand their skills and imaginations while working on individual projects. The projects are theme based and encourage students to think deeply on the subject of their study and apply a visual approach to self and collective expression. Students will experience how professional artists work with materials, techniques and ideas when creating art, and how to put together work that will culminate in a public presentation.

Maximum of 16 student spots available.

QUANTUM – WINNIPEG FILM GROUP (Grades 9 to 12)

This program introduces students to the basic outline of program structure and the 10 weeks of workshops. Students and coordinator build, breakdown, block, and direct a scene together learning how to incorporate filmic storytelling devices such as: set(s), props, acting technique, text, and directing.

Maximum of 10 student spots available.

ADDITIONAL COMMUNITY ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES

WINNIPEG ART GALLERY (GRADES 3 to 12)

Students enrolled will showcase their artwork in the WAG's new Through the Eyes of a Child Gallery. The gallery is currently in development, but we hope to have it completed by the end of 2022. Students will create, curate, and install their artwork in the permanent gallery, and have it on display for one week before rotating to the next class. Classes run in three seasons, Fall, Winter and Spring.

- Young Artist Program (Grades 3 to 6) runs nine weeks per season. Students sign up for either a Saturday or Sunday session from 9:30 to 11:30 am. (Saturdays max of 32 students and Sundays max of 32 students).
- Teen Artist Program (Grades 7 to 12) runs 10 weeks per season; maximum of 24 students per session. Classes run each Sunday.
 - Fall Session: Total of 12 students from Grades 11 to 12 (11:15 am to 1:15 pm) and a total of 12 students from Grades 9 to 10 (2:00 to 4:00 pm)
 - Winter Session: Total of 12 students from Grades 11 to 12 (11:15 am to1:15 pm) and a total of 12 students from Grades 9 to 10 (2:00 to 4:00 pm)
 - **Spring Session:** Total of 12 students from Grades 7 to 8 (11:15 am to 1:15 pm) and a total of 12 students from Grades 7 to 8 (2:00 to 4:00 pm)
- Art Expressions Program (Grades 3 to 8) runs ten weeks per group (max 9 groups per year with 8 students per group). Classes run 1.5 hours on weekday mornings or afternoons; exact day and time to be decided by the participating school. These classes vary per season based on the availability of the school, and their ability to provide transportation. Dates are organized between the instructor and the school. Classes are intended for students who lack language, reading and writing skills and need an alternate form of communication, and highly introverted, shy or non-communicative, and/or need a way to build self-confidence. Schools will send a small group of students who they feel would benefit from expressing themselves artistically.

ROYAL WINNIPEG BALLET SHARING DANCE PROGRAM

Sharing Dance is rooted in our shared belief that all people, regardless of age, ability or location should have access to the physical, emotional, and social benefits of dance. The RWB School is focused primarily on Sharing Dance Kids, a branch of the program designed to foster artistic engagement, build self-confidence, and develop physical literacy in children and youth. Shared Dance Kids includes free online resources such as downloadable lesson plans, video content, music, and more. MANITOBA THEATRE FOR YOUNG PEOPLE (K to Grade 12)

MTYP is planning to present seven plays for students, two of which will be touring across Manitoba. WSD schools will receive subsidized tickets to shows ranging from \$7.50 or \$9.00, depending on the show and tour booking fees are \$600.00 for one (1) performance.

ROYAL MANITOBA THEATRE CENTRE

RMTC is offering six student-only matinees of different productions. All performances will be held at 11:30 am.

Schools receive information and register directly with the program.

MANITOBA CHILDREN'S MUSEUM FREE2PLAY PROGRAM (K to Grade 6)

Helps children develop essential foundational skills by nurturing the power of the imagination and the spirit of self-discovery. This program will bring a group of division students with varying needs to the museum for gallery explorations, school visits, and after-school STEAM Club sessions – all free of charge!

MBA Summer Band Camps

Students register for summer band camps in May and the Division supplies scholarship funds towards registration. Middle School Band programs will receive \$380.00 and Senior Band Programs will receive \$415.00. Teachers are to decide how to split the money up amongst students (ie: scholarship money can be used towards one student to attend a camp, or it can be divided for partial scholarships for several students to go). If a school does not use their scholarship money, then other schools with participating students will receive more. Parents/Guardians are responsible to pay any remaining part of the camp fees that their child wishes to attend. There are no paper form options for camp applicants. FUNDING & RESOURCES

WINNIPEG SCHOOL DIVISION FUNDING

CENTRAL ARTS BUDGET

Schools will receive Arts funding from the Division in the amount of \$750.00 to be disbursed between all Arts programming. It is to be used for arts supplies, arts material, arts equipment, or artist fee for service.

Funds will be transferred to school account # 01 1x0-326-7100 xxx.

MAJOR ART HOLDBACK GRANT

Schools will be invited to apply for funding to support major purchases for arts education. The funding can include the replacement and upgrades to spaces, equipment, furniture and technology and/or to support expanding arts programming being offered to students. Changes to school building spaces will require consultation with the Building Department.

Musical instruments will not be eligible. More information to follow.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENT PURCHASES

The Winnipeg School Division provides an opportunity annually for schools to request instruments to replace existing instruments or to expand their programming.

Instrument Request forms will be sent out mid-January for the 2023-2024 school year.

MUSIC INSTRUMENT REPAIRS

Funds to pay for musical instrument repair costs will be allocated to each school based on the last year's September 30th student enrolment in Band and Guitar. Schools will receive \$32.00 per student enrolled in BAND and \$15.00 per student enrolled in GUITAR. Repairs to equipment can be made by the school's choice of vendor(s). Schools are responsible for the payment of the repair costs.

Funding for Music Instrument Repairs is in the process of review for the 2023-2024 school year.

LARGE INSTRUMENT REPAIRS & CLEANING

Please enter your information on the google doc and then make appropriate arrangements to have your instruments picked up by the vendor of your choice. Ensure that the invoices are billed to WSD and sent to the Superintendents' Department for payment by mid-June. We realize the repairs/cleaning may not be completed by then, but we need to ensure that these costs are paid for in the year that they are invoiced.
