

The first step to a career in education

Indigenous students from Winnipeg School Division may begin their journey to become a certified teacher in the Build From Within – Ozhitoon Onji Peenjiiee program. Cohorts of 30 students engage in an academically rigorous program while receiving cultural, familial, community, mentorship, and financial supports.

Build From Within (BFW) starts in high school and continues throughout the completion of a five-year integrated Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Education degree. Students also complete an Educational Assistant Diploma (EADP) while earning their high school diploma.

Students obtain additional classroom experience in a Winnipeg School Division early years school setting while attending university. This valuable first-hand learning enhances their journey to becoming a teacher.

Build From Within Cohort is accepting applications from recent WSD high school Indigenous graduates.

September 2024 — Cohort 4 begins

Grade 12 — Semester 1

- Students attend Argyle Alternative High School as a cohort
- In the morning, students work on their Educational Assistant Diploma (University of Winnipeg)
- In the afternoon, students work on their high school credits

Grade 12 - Semester 2

- Students attend Argyle Alternative High School as a cohort
- In the morning, students work on their Educational Assistant Diploma (University of Winnipeg)
- In the afternoon, students work on their high school credits
- June 2025 return to respective home high school to graduate or remain at Argyle to graduate
- June 2025 complete Educational Assistant Diploma

September 2025 – Cohort 4 begins five-year Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Education

Each year students:

- Attend University of Winnipeg
- Attend in-school classroom placements
- Attend Internship and Mentorship with BFW program staff

What is provided with Build From Within:

- Tuition to the University of Winnipeg
- Cultural and language learning
- Connections to mentors
- Fun team building days

Student Responsibilities and Requirements

- Desire to become a teacher
- Have completed 22 high school credits by June 2024
- Proof of Indigenous ancestry (needed for funding purposes)
- Demonstrates good citizenship in school and community
- Strong accountability and communication with BFW staff, University Instructors and Support Team
- Commitment to completing homework
- Excellent attendance
- Desire to contribute to Indigenous Education and participate in cultural learning opportunities
- Able to meet university acceptance requirements (which includes Applied or Pre-Cal Math)
