#### Lunch Program News



At this point in the 2023-2024 school year, we are able to offer this program at no cost. Lunch program supervisors are nonteaching staff from the school.

Priority will be given to students in grades 1-6 who have parents/guardians/caregivers who are out of the home working, going to school, or attending programs over the lunch hour. Additionally, due to our limited supervision we ask that students who are **not** registered in lunch program do not return to the school until 12:55 PM at which time they will be met by their classroom teachers. Grade 7 and 8 students are not eligible for the lunch program. Children who are registered in the lunch program are asked to bring a peanut-free readyto-eat lunch daily. Please provide utensils if needed. Microwaves are not available. **Registrations forms are available in the office, all students staying for lunch will need to register for the lunch program.** 

#### **School Supplies**
